The U.S. Department of Homeland Security's (DHS) Customs and Border Protection (CBP) enforces APHIS regulations at ports of entry. CBP agriculture specialists inspect shipments of imported products and ensure that the required permits, sanitary certificates (for animal products), and phytosanitary certificates (for plant products) accompany each shipment.

In order to avoid potential problems in the clearance of your merchandise, CBP strongly recommends that you familiarize yourself with the agency's policies and procedures prior to actually importing your goods.
